Tony Robertson. Tony is a skilled woodworker who first heard of Bag Books through the Radio 4 Appeal. He found the concept of hand crafted multi-sensory stories inspiring, and wanted to contribute his talents and tools to helping Bag Books. Since he started volunteering for Bag Books, Tony has made 60 drum beater handles, 60 disks for an Oyster card reader, 200 beautiful wooden seeds and 200 plant pot lids in his garden shed workshop. He then delivers them in person and is seen below with some of the workshop team.



Yewande Ogunnaike. Yewande is a mother of three children. Her youngest, Olugbenga, has Down Syndrome, Autism and Attention Deficit Disorder. Yewande started volunteering at Bag Books as she felt grateful for all the support she has received whilst caring for Olugbenga, and decided she wanted to give something back. Since she started volunteering in our craft workshop, Yewande has eyeletted 60 pirate hats, stuffed ten pairs of rubber gloves and eight baby Jesus's with cotton wool, cleaned 30 bottles of suncream and punched holes in 40 Oyster cards.

Chantelle Bell. Chantelle Bell is an illustration student at Westminster University, who prefers hand painting to digital processes. In the summer break between her second and third year, Chantelle has been spending a day a week at the Bag Books workshop and has made 25 wooden oars, bagged and packed 20 "Captain's Hat" stories, assembled 15 pairs of clopping horses' hooves and created 11 rainbow sticks for our new story, "The Little Seed".

She worked for several years on the international exchange project "Contacting the World" and has directed theatre projects with young people living in areas of conflict. Diane works regularly as a Clowndoctor and Elderflower for Hearts&Minds, creating performed interventions with children in hospitals and hospices, and with ladies and gentleman with dementia. She lives in Argyll where she runs a forest and beach adventure group for the under 5s and performs interactive forest theatre for families.
